RULES FOR JUDGING NATIONAL AUDITIONS

Level I PRELIMINARIES and Level II SEMIFINALS: Judges must assign a rating, as "A", "B", "C", "D". The judges should give an "A" rating to ONLY those contestants that <u>are ready for a national concert career.</u> "B" is somewhat below that rating (and may be the highest rating a judge gives in case he/she feels that no contestant is ready for a national career). "C" is still lower, and so on.

Level III FINALS: Judges, individually, must <u>rank</u> the contestants. "1" for the best. "2" for the next best, etc. All contestants must be ranked.

For all judging: Other than discussion about choosing pieces that you would like to hear and timing, there is to be no discussion between the judges, and judges may not confer with each other. Ties shall not be declared for any awards that are given.
